‘A’ DRAW

Boys – 12 Teams

- 1 round robin, 2 pools of 6
- 1st and 2nd qualifiers in each pool play 1-4 SF/F
- 3rd and 4th qualifiers in each pool to play 5-8 SF/F
- 5th and 6th qualifiers in each pool to play 9-12 SF/F

Girls – 9 Teams

- 1 round robin; 1 pool of 4 and 1 pools of 5
- 1st and 2nd qualifiers in each pool advance to semi finals
- 3rd and 4th in each pool to play 5-8 semi final
 - Winners advance to the 5/6 playoff
 - Losers play in 7-9 Bottom 3 round robin with 5th Pool B

Seeding of teams is taken from the final team placing of the 2017 A Secondary School National Championship and the Qualifiers from the 2018 A Premierships. Results from external (non BBNZ) competitions and/or tournaments are not used in the seeding process.

Boys – 24 Teams

- 1 round robin; 4 pools of 6
- 1st in each pool qualify automatically for the 1-8 QF’s
- 2nd and 3rd in each pool play a Preliminary Quarter Final
 - Winners advance to the 1-8 QF’s
 - Losers advance to the 9-16 QF’s
- 4th in each pool play in the 9-16 Quarter Finals, Semi Finals and Finals
- 5th and 6th in each pool play in the 17-24 Quarter Finals, Semi Finals and Finals

Girls – 24 Teams

- 1 round robin; 4 pools of 6
- 1st in each pool qualify automatically for the 1-8 QF’s
- 2nd and 3rd in each pool play a Preliminary Quarter Final
 - Winners advance to the 1-8 QF’s
 - Losers advance to the 9-16 QF’s
- 4th in each pool play in the 9-16 Quarter Finals, Semi Finals and Finals
- 5th and 6th in each pool play in the 17-24 Quarter Finals, Semi Finals and Finals

Seeding of teams is taken from the final team placing of the 2017 AA Secondary School National Championship and the Qualifiers from the 2018 AA Premierships. Results from external (non BBNZ) competitions and/or tournaments are not used in the seeding process.

Technical Meeting

- The technical meeting will be held on Sunday, September 30th at 6:30pm in the tournament office located on the mezzanine floor of the B&M Centre.
- Registrations will be open from 5:30pm onwards for teams to sign in, collect your tournament packs and to check your playing roster is correct. If you have changes to your team roster, please ensure all the correct documentation is provided, which must include sign off by the principal.
- Failing to attend the technical meeting may result in your team not receiving important information or possible changes to the tournament. It is the Head Coach or manager's responsibility to ensure the team is updated with information that was provided at the technical meeting. Please note the technical meeting is your last chance to change your playing roster, no changes may be made after this – remember, changes must be accompanied by a signed roster form.

Opening Ceremony

- While coaches and managers are attending the technical meeting, players are to attend the opening ceremony, which is held at the same time as the technical meeting. The Opening Ceremony will be held on Sunday, September 30th at 6:30pm in Fly Palmy Arena (Arena 2).
- All teams to arrive at 6pm ready and seated for a 6:30pm start
- All team captains will be seated in a reserved area. They are to remain in the Fly Palmy Arena foyer with Sport Manawatu as the official opening party of the tournament. Captains of the teams with trophies will walk at the front of this group. All captains should meet at 6.10pm in the Foyer of Arena 2. Further information will be explained when the captains assemble.
- The opening ceremony is compulsory and all players are to wear their School uniform or number ones/tracksuits.

- Fly Palmy Arena entrance is through the Marist carpark and parking can be found on Pascal Street. If you have any queries, regarding the opening ceremony please make contact with Muz from Sport Manawatu at muzs@sportmanawatu.org.nz



Rules Sessions

There are a number of FIBA rules changes that come into effect international on 1 October 2018. BBNZ will be adopting these changes in 2019. Melony Wealleans the BBNZ Referee Development Manger will hold two rules sessions to cover the changes:

- Sunday, 30 September after the technical meeting
- Saturday, 6 October 2:30pm

Tournament Controls and Information Desks

BBNZ Tournament Office

The BBNZ tournament office is located on the corporate lounge level in Fly Palmy Arena for the duration of the tournament. Please approach the tournament control before making your way up to the tournament office.

Scorebench Duty

Basketball Manawatu will endeavor to cover all scorebench throughout the duration of the tournament. If you have any queries, please make contact with Helen Richardson from Basketball Manawatu.

In the event they do not cover all benches and your team is asked to help on duty please assist where necessary.



Playing Uniform

Each team must bring two alternate uniforms to the tournament. Uniform numbers must be 0 and 00 and 1 to 99.

The following are permitted:

- Shoulder, upper arm, thigh or lower leg protective equipment if the material is sufficiently padded.
- Compression sleeves of the same dominant colour as the shirts.
- Compression stockings of the same dominant colour as the shorts. If for the upper leg it must end above the knee; if for the lower leg it must end below the knee.

If your main and alternate strip has different numbers, you will need to make changes to the scoresheet as only one set of numbers will be pre-printed.

Times

- **Warm Up** - minimum of 10 minutes
- **Playing Time** - 4 x 10 minute stop clock quarters
- **Half Time** - 5 minutes (may change to 10mins during SF's and/or GF's)
- **Quarter Time Intervals** - 2 minutes
- **Extra Periods** - 5 minutes
- **Extra Period Intervals** - 2 minutes

Important Details

- **Forfeit of Game** - \$500 fine.
- **Team Benches** – Sitting at the scorebench; Team A **MUST** sit to the left and Team B **MUST** sit to the right. Please ensure all games start correctly with this procedure. Only the rostered players and management are allowed to sit on the team bench. All supporters must sit in the stands.
- **Scorebench** - If there is a problem with the scorebench, only the coach may approach on a dead ball and then ask the referee to check the enquiry. Other management may approach the bench during the 2 minute break at quarter time and at half time. They **MUST NOT** approach the bench any other time to check the score sheet or query the scorebench.
- **Rules** - The tournament will use BBNZ Internal Regulations, FIBA Rules, NZSSSC Regulations and Eligibility and BBNZ match fixing regulations.
- **Mouthguards** - Mouthguards are compulsory for all players.

Team Roster

Please ensure that all your players are registered with the BBNZ office and are eligible to compete in the tournament and that all players comply with NZSSSC rules and regulations. A reminder that only a maximum of 12 players can participate in the tournament, the final 12 players must be confirmed at the technical meeting this is your last chance to change your playing roster, no changes may be made after this. Any changes must be accompanied by a signed NZSSSC roster form.

Score Sheets

Score sheets will be located at the tournament control desk. Please ensure that all players are listed on this score sheet as they will be checked against team rosters and no further changes are allowed to players named at the technical meeting. All further score sheets will be completed for your team and can be located at the control desks at least 15 minutes prior to your game.

Once a team's first game commences, only those players listed on the scoresheet for the first game may participate in the remainder of that Tournament as players. [BBNZ Internal Regulations F1.5].

Even though all scoresheets will be preprinted, coaches and managers are required to check your scoresheets to ensure players and their details are correct and listed.

BBNZ Code of Conduct and Fairplay

Please ensure that all your participants (coaches, managers, players, spectators, parents, officials) read and abide by the BBNZ Code of Conducts.

- Floor Controllers are able to assist with basic first aid and are first aid certified.

Door Charge and Entry

All Entry will be through Fly Palmy Arena entrance, no entry through B&M centre as years before. Each team will receive a maximum of 15 passes per team (12 x players and 3 x team management). Please ensure that the correct pass is worn on arrival and departure of the stadium. Any extra passes for travelling spectators and extra team management can be purchased at the door on arrival. Team passes will be placed in your tournament pack, available for pick up at the technical meeting.
